Requirements:

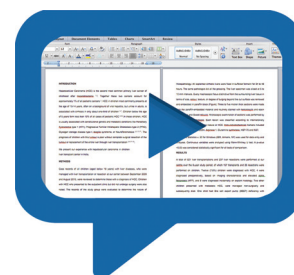
1. Young investigator younger than 40 years

3. Filmed in landscape format
4. No longer than 30 seconds
5. Must not deviate from conclusions of the article.
6. *Transplantation* reserves the right to edit content deemed outside these requirements.
7. Should be accompanied by a short letter of introduction that provides accepted article's title and/or article number, the author listing of the article, and contact information.
