### Call for Papers

*The Canadian Journal of Addiction* is excited to announce a **Call for Papers** for a Special Issue: “Current Perspectives on Alcohol” for publication in Fall/Winter 2020.



Alcohol use is the most prevalent substance use in Canada, causing a large impact on individuals, communities and society at large. Due to the large burden induced by alcohol and alcohol use disorders, it is important to promote dissemination of research findings and clinical issues related to the management of alcohol. We expect that those factors would be relevant for a variety of stakeholders such as health care providers, researchers, and policy makers.

### Specific topics of interest include:

- Determinants of alcohol use in general population and special populations (e.g., youth, persons with mental health disorders, older adults, veterans, etc.)
- Determinants of Alcohol Use Disorder
- Group and psychotherapy approaches for Alcohol Use Disorder treatment
- Pharmacotherapies for Alcohol Use Disorder
- Harm reduction approaches
- Controlled drinking approaches
- Neurobiological and/or imaging findings related to Alcohol
- Negative impact of alcohol use (on various variables, e.g. driving, violence, psychological, organ toxicity...)
- Biomarkers related to alcohol use
- Advertisement and Public perceptions
- Policy control and drinking guidelines
- Alcohol and pregnancy and Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders

### Submission Details and Deadline

We encourage submission of original research reports, brief reports, systematic reviews, and narrative reviews in this area (see link to authors' guidelines below). Short expert commentaries will also be considered with prior approval of the Special Issue Editor. Case reports will not be considered for this issue.
