The *Journal of the Egyptian Public Health Association (JEPHA)* is planning to enlarge its **Reviewer Database** by inviting a limited number of reviewers to join our devoted team. If you are interested in fulfilling this vital role we would be very pleased to hear from you. Suggested names of other potential reviewers for us to approach are always welcome. Reviewers are listed alongside Editorial Board members in the journal.

JEPHA was the first Egyptian journal indexed in PubMed (1946); however, it hasn't yet been given an impact factor. We are looking forward to an evaluation by Thomson Reuters (ISI) and the eventual award of an impact factor. International diversity of authors, editorial board and advisory members of the board is one of the selection criteria for inclusion in Thomson Reuters' database.

Reviewers from countries *other than Egypt* who are interested in peer reviewing original research in the full spectrum of public health and community medicine fields, in particular, epidemiology, health management, statistics, occupational and environmental, family and tropical health can submit the below stated essential information for our consideration to: jepha_Alex@yahoo.com

1. Full name, title, and professional qualifications.
2. Current contact details, including postal address, telephone and fax numbers, and email address.
3. Periods when the reviewer does not want to receive manuscripts for review. This should cover both regular times such as annual examination periods, and single or infrequent instances, for example sabbaticals, parental leave, or absence due to personal or family reasons.
4. Areas of interest and expertise, with, if possible, some indication of the level of knowledge and familiarity with these various areas. A note should be made if the person has any unique or unusual combination of

knowledge, skills or expertise. It's important that the information kept on people's interests and expertise is that which will best help the journal identify specific reviewers. You can refer to the "Medical Subject Headings" of the US National Library of Medicine, MeSH®; www.nlm.nih.gov/mesh/) to specify your areas of interest and expertise.

University staff (middle career and senior professors) and PhD holders will have priority in the selection process.
