


Call for Manuscripts:

Traumatic Brain Injury and Opioids

Topics of interest include (but are not limited to):

- Characterization and patterns of prescription opioid utilization post-TBI
- The role of opioids and/or nonpharmacological treatments for persons with TBI and chronic pain or polytrauma
- Illicit opioid use following TBI
- Risk for opioid misuse or opioid use disorder following TBI
- Access to, barriers, or experiences in opioid use disorder treatment among persons with TBI
- Overlapping receipt of prescription opioids and benzodiazepines following TBI
- Association of opioid use following TBI and risk for adverse outcomes
- Prescription opioid receipt during acute inpatient rehabilitation following TBI
- Cumulative effects of TBI and overdose

Articles of interest include both original research and systematic reviews. Research letters, as described in the Instructions For Authors, are welcome.

Timeline for this JHTR Special issue is as follows:

01/05/2021 (earlier encouraged): **Abstract submissions due** (250 words), with headings of Background, Objective, Methods, Results, and Conclusion. Abstracts should be submitted to radams@brandeis.edu

01/15/2021: **Notification of decisions for full paper submission** will be emailed to first authors. Invited papers will undergo masked peer review.

03/15/2021: **Full papers to be uploaded to the JHTR** editorial manager website to meet an expected 09/01/2021 publication deadline.
