


Call for Manuscripts

## Mobile Technology and Brain Injury Rehabilitation



A Topical Issue of the Journal for Head Trauma Rehabilitation (JHTR) a Wolters Kluwer Publication (<https://journals.lww.com/headtraumarehab/pages/default.aspx>)

Topics of interest include (but are not limited to):

- Applications of mobile technology, such as wearable devices, to characterizing health and function in individuals with brain injury
- Interventions that make use of mobile apps or other mobile technology (e.g. smart watches, wearable devices)
- Mobile app-based assessments of mood and cognition in individuals with brain injury
- Ecological momentary assessment (EMA) of psychosocial and functional outcomes using mobile technology
- Methodological papers on the use of mobile sensor data to characterize brain injury outcomes

Original research articles will be given preference over systematic reviews. Research letters, as described in the *Instructions For Authors*, are welcome. JHTR rarely publishes case studies or preclinical investigations. Research may employ quantitative or qualitative methodologies.

Timeline for this JHTR Special issue is as follows:

- 5/1/2021 (earlier encouraged): Abstract submissions due to the Topical Issue Editors (250 words), with headings of Background, Objective, Methods, Results, and Conclusion.
- 6/1/2021: Notification of decisions for full paper submission emailed to first authors.
- 9/1/2021 (earlier encouraged): deadline for full manuscripts to be uploaded to the JHTR Editorial Manager website
- All papers will undergo masked peer review.
- Expected publication date is March 2022
