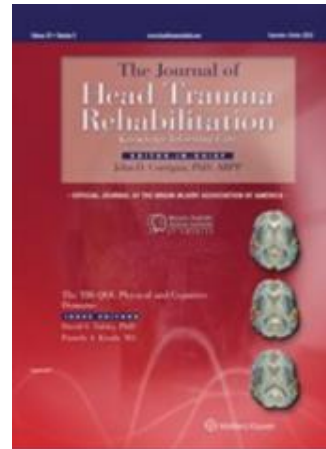


Call for Manuscripts

Studies of interest will address Social Determinants of Health (SDoH) affecting those living with traumatic brain injury (TBI) including, but not limited to:

- Impact of SDoH on health status
- Access to resources (e.g., healthcare, disability-related services) and SDoH
- Impact of SDoH on short- and long-term recovery
- Assessment or measurement of SDoH

Both original empirical studies and systematic reviews are invited. *All invited papers will undergo masked peer review and are not guaranteed publication.* Contributions must address issues important to recovery from a TBI or living with the effects of TBI.

Timeline for this *JHTR* Topical Issue is as follows:

- 11/1/21:** A synopsis (up to 500 words), with headings of Background, Objective, Methods, Results, and Conclusion, should be submitted to: Adam.Kinney@cuanschutz.edu. Specific information regarding design and methods should be included.
- 12/1/21:** Notification of invitation for full paper submission will be e-mailed to first author
- 3/1/22:** Full papers uploaded to the *JHTR* Editorial Manager submission site no later than 3/1/22, earlier is encouraged.
- 9/1/22:** Expected publication date
