James Neuberger was born in London. He trained in Physiological Sciences (MA) and Medicine (BM BCh) at the University of Oxford and University College Hospital, London. After various medical posts, in 1974 he was appointed to the Liver Unit at Kings College Hospital, initially as a Research fellow and subsequently as a Senior Lecturer. He completed his postgraduate research with a Doctorate of Medicine from Oxford University in 1981. During this time, he was actively involved in the developing Liver Transplant Programme at Addenbrookes Hospital. In 1998, he was appointed to his present post in the Liver Unit at Birmingham, where he is a Consultant Physician in the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, Birmingham and Honorary Professor of Medicine in the University of Birmingham. He is also Medical Director for Research and Development. He was made a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of London in 1984.

Research: Research interests include clinical aspects of liver transplantation and autoimmune liver diseases. He has travelled and lectured widely and has been Visiting Professor in Europe and North America. He is currently President of the British Association for the Study of the Liver.

Competing Interests: He has been an Associate Editor for the Journal of Hepatology and on the editorial board of several liver and transplant journals. He has received lecture fees and funding for travel and meeting attendance from Astellas, Wyeth, and Novartis. He has also participated in clinical studies sponsored by Astellas, Wyeth, and Novartis.
